Academics

Students must enroll in all of the following courses:

- > **ART 358 Venice Biennale and International Influence (Studio)**
- > **ART 315 Venice Biennale (Art History)**

The Venice Biennale, founded in 1895, is one of the most prestigious art expositions and cultural institutions in the world. It continues to promote new artistic trends and acts as the epicenter of global contemporary art events.

Students will expand their skills in art and art history under the direction of Marist Professor of Art, Ed Smith, a Guggenheim Fellow and an associate fellow of the Royal British Society of Sculpture, and an LdM Professor, curator, consultant, and supervisor of Art History.

Each participant will cultivate a body of work with concentrations in painting, drawing, sculpture, digital photography, and cross-disciplinary art for a culminating exhibition. They will also explore contemporary art and culture through a combination of onsite lectures, studio art workshops, and critiques.

Students will enjoy access to museums such as the Peggy Guggenheim Collection, Galleries dell'Accademia, Scula San Rocco, Punta della Dogana, and the Biennale Festival, and have free time to explore Venice, its outlying islands, and other significant sites in the Veneto region.

Housing

Double-or triple-occupancy rooms.

Program Fee: \$6,500

Program fee includes tuition for the six credits, onsite transportation, accommodations, welcome and/or farewell dinner, entrance pass to the Biennale di Venezia festival, a vaporetto pass, and health insurance.

Program fee does not include airfare, meals other than those included in the itinerary, passport, visa (if needed), U.S. airport transfer, individual art materials and personal expenses.

The program fee will be invoiced in May for the summer session. Marist College students may be eligible to apply for financial aid for this program; please contact the Marist College Office of Student Financial Services.
